


What is the EU Taxonomy?

- Classification scheme for environmentally sustainable economic activities
 - Mandatory for large corporations and banks
 - Voluntary for other market participants to attract green investments or screen investments
- Four overarching conditions for Taxonomy alignment
- Six environmental objectives
 - Climate mitigation and adaptation now legislated for many sectors (not all!)
 - Water, circular economy, pollution, and biodiversity still being developed






EU Taxonomy - Agriculture





EU Taxonomy - Transport

- Transport: ~16.9% of global emissions
 - Similar for Australia, but higher for EU



- Technical screening criteria for climate mitigation and adaptation:
 - Passenger transport, freight, low-carbon infrastructure
 - Covers transport on land and inland waterways, plus some marine transport
 - Zero tailpipe emissions, not life-cycle (...yet?)
- Draft technical screening criteria for pollution prevention and control
 - Zero tailpipe emission and noise limits for land transport
 - Zero particulate emission, oil, water, and noise pollution limits for marine transport
- Draft technical screening criteria for climate mitigation for the aviation sector
 - Zero tailpipe emission
 - Some 'best in class' until 2027
 - 100% sustainable aviation fuel from 2028 to 2032



Australian Taxonomy project

Strategic Partnerships for the Implementation of the Paris Agreement (SPIPA)

- Australian Sustainable Finance Institute
 - Includes banks, super funds, insurers, peak finance bodies, academia, and civil society
 - Observers from APRA, ASIC, and UNEP-FI
- November 2020: Australian Sustainable Finance Roadmap
 - 37 recommendations across four domains
 - Short-, medium-, and long-term action plans
- Development of an Australian Taxonomy is a 'high priority' for the Council of Financial Regulators



Recommendation 9

Australia's financial system participants establish a key project to explore the implementation of a sustainable finance taxonomy in Australia. The project should involve a broad group of key stakeholders, including civil society, asset owners, asset managers, banks, insurers, financial regulators, legal experts, industry experts, technology experts, sustainability experts, state governments, and the Australian Government.



Questions and lessons for Australia

- Legislated regulation vs voluntary industry-led
 - What are the goals?
 - Who is making the decisions?
 - Small target group not connected to industry?
 - Larger group vested interests?
 - What is the basis for decision-making?
- Technical decisions
 - What are the environmental goals?
 - Who are the primary users? And how should it be used?
 - Which sectors should be covered?
 - Which concepts should be used?
 - How should transitional activities be covered?
 - How should the taxonomy interact with other policies?

- Should an Australian taxonomy align with the EU?
 - Clear and consistent guidance for investors and companies
 - Doesn't consider different regional contexts
 - Could partially align, or agree on 'mapping'
